



KITTEN WELLNESS PLAN

To ensure the best health for your kitten, Kimberly Crest Veterinary Hospital offers a “Kitten Wellness Plan” to owners of young kittens. To take advantage of this program, kittens must meet the following age requirements. Our hospital offers the following package at a **minimum savings of 30%**.

KITTENS

(Younger than 9 weeks)

- 5 Complete physical exams
- 4 Distemper, Rhinotracheitis, Calici, Chlamydia vaccinations
- 2 Leukemia vaccinations
- Leukemia/FIV Test
- 10% discount on 2nd Leukemia/FIV test
- Rabies vaccination
- 2 stool tests for internal parasites (add'l tests at 10% discount)
- Any necessary dewormings (min.2)
- Nail trims
- 10% office visit and progress exam discount for 6 months
- Initial dose of heartworm and flea & tick prevention

Total: \$447.76

(Older than 9 weeks)

- 4 Complete physical exams
- 3 Distemper, Rhinotracheitis, Calici, Chlamydia vaccinations
- 2 Leukemia vaccinations
- Leukemia/FIV Test
- 10% discount on 2nd Leukemia/FIV test
- Rabies vaccination
- 2 stool tests for internal parasites (add'l tests at 10% discount)
- Any necessary dewormings (min. 2)
- Nail trims
- 10% office visit and progress exam discount for 6 months
- Initial dose of heartworm and flea & tick prevention

Total: \$391.08

Include a Spay or Neuter at the time of the wellness purchase for an additional 5% savings.

Including Neuter - \$791.59

Including Spay - \$948.49
Including Neuter - \$737.67

The pet package does not include vitamins, medications (except dewormings), coat conditioners, prescription diets, heartworm medications (except for introductory dose), or external parasite products. The “Kitten Wellness Plan” fee is payable at the initial visit or you may pay half on the initial visit and the remainder on the second visit the following month. Those purchasing the wellness plan including a spay or neuter may make three equal monthly payments. The program must be completed by 6 months of age.

This package is transferable but is nonrefundable.

A veterinarian recommended surgery delay for medical reasons may affect price. – (12/13)
